

I'm referring to Mr. Royce Anderson, a career serviceman and Naval Officer and one of a handful of Naval black aviators during a time when there were not a lot of opportunities for men of color. Raised and educated in the south, he attended Savannah State as an undergraduate, and earned Master's degree at the prestigious Morehouse College in Atlanta and Eastern Michigan University in Ypsilanti, Michigan (near Ann Arbor). Royce enlisted for a short stint in the Air Force before transferring to the US Navy. Commissioned in 1971, he found his calling as a Naval Aviator. He passed away 19 July surrounded by family and friends. God speed! Royce Anderson and Fair Winds and Following Seas.
