

while entertaining the community service of Masonic Diversity Lodge 330 and their annual tribute to Veterans. Later that evening, the Marine Corps Ball commenced as we applauded and were spellbound by the richness and candor of our guest speaker.

The MOC/MOCA gathered for their 87th Annual National Tomb Trek on 5-6 November, at the Sheraton in Arlington, VA, led by our Seam Squirrel, Robert "Check" Adamczyk, and Grand MOC Ben Guinan to conduct meetings and plan for the coming year. But more importantly, they laid wreaths at the Gen John J. Pershing, and SGT Younger gravesites symbolizing the Meuse-Argonne Offensive (September 26 to November 11, 1918) that helped conclude World War I, which involved some 1.2 million Americans and was the deadliest military campaign in history resulting in more than 26,000 Americans killed and over 120,000 wounded. Before they wrapped up the weekend the Supreme Commander and Presidents would lay a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. You see, the Cooties, like you, are all about the care of our veterans. One of our favorite slogans is "Keep 'em Smilin in Beds of White". Check out the MOC/MOCA corner for more details.

Our Veterans Day commemoration on 11 November at Quantico was held but abbreviated due to inclement weather. I attended along with our Post Adjutant Randy Coker and Senior Vice/Grand MOC Ben Guinan. It was my first appearance at this ceremony, and it did not disappoint. I'd have to say the most riveting part of the ceremony was given by 98 year old Colonel Frank W. Harris III, USMC (Ret) who gave the most eloquent rendition of a toast to the flag. Our current Lt. Governor,

the Honorable Winsome Earle-Sears also graced the ceremony with her presence and words, altogether an inspiring event and if you can in the future, please attend. It will be worth your while.

A hearty thanks to Masonic Diversity Lodge 330, who come rain or shine to give thanks to veterans each Veterans Day weekend. For more than 12 years they've served up some of the best burgers, hotdogs, and fries along with good music and plenty of camaraderie. As we closed out the afternoon and exchanged gifts and pleasantries, we all reflected on why we formed these organizations and how important they are in continuing to support the needs of our members.



CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

A Life of Thanks-Living

The Law of Who Now

For whom are you grateful for in your life right now? Have you let them know lately how much you appreciate them? If not, give the gift today!

The Law of Focus

When we focus on what we lack, we tend to look out for ourselves. Conversely, when we focus on our blessings, we tend to find ourselves looking out for others as well as ourselves.

The Law of Abundance

Author Stephen Glenn has this definition of abundance: "In terms of the population of the planet, you have abundance if, when you wake up each morning, you have a choice of what to eat; choice of what to wear; a job to go to; and a way to get there."

November was a very exciting month for us in that the FOB system has now officially been issued to over 900 members (and seems to be working for the most part). Also, towards the end of the month we had our credit card and POS problem's addressed with the installation of all new wiring throughout the building, equals better service at the bar.

Sorry, to announce that starting in December it will be necessary for us to raise the price's for both our food and drinks (liquor-beer). Prices continue to go up, this needs to be addressed immediately. We have been able to offer the lowest prices around for many years in both of these categories. And that was because of our supplemental income from our games offered in the canteen (V tabs - Wall tickets - Jar Tickets).

A recent proposal has been introduced to the state to make changes to Charitable Gaming Licensee's, that would not allow us to continue to disperse funds from them as we have in the past to cover operating expenses. More info will follow as it comes available to us, but wanted to touch base with you about what new challenges we are facing.

On a more pleasant note we are looking forward to once again helping needy families from five different schools with our **CHRISTMAS FOOD BASKET** program. Food gift cards are being mailed out to 94 families representing 500 people. Amount of donations range between \$50.00 to \$150.00 dependent on the number of people in each family (Low of 3 to High of 15) this year.

Comrades and Auxiliary members,

November was another busy month for us in the MOC/MOCA. Early in the month, we attended our 87th annual Tomb Trek in Arlington, VA. Many thanks to Ken and Marcia Eggers and all those that helped them run the Virginia Hospitality Room. A great time was had by all. What's Tomb Trek? Glad you asked!



Way back in 1921, four unknown, unidentifiable soldiers were exhumed from four World War I American cemeteries in France. A soldier named Edward F. Younger was chosen as the person who would select the soldier to be buried in Arlington National Cemetery in the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. The other three soldiers were interred in the Meuse Argonne Cemetery, France. Sqt. Younger went on to become a VFW member and a Cootie from Pup Tent 1 in Washington, DC. Sgt. Younger asked Congress to extend the honor of laying a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Solider to the Military Order of the Cootie. No one in congress would deny him this request. For 87 years, the MOC/MOCA have been laying wreaths in Arlington National Cemetery to include at Sqt. Younger's gravesite. Depending on situations at Arlington, sometimes the wreaths are laid at the Argonne Cross, sometimes at General Pershing's gravesite, but Supreme Leadership still makes it over to the Tomb itself and lays a wreath.

In the ramp up to Thanksgiving, the MOCA put on their usual Bake Sale outside of Bingo. Thanks to all who donated, made items, and purchased some of the goodies!
