COMMANDER'S CORNER



CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

The Process of Grief

The members of our post have recently suffered a series of difficult losses, both collectively and individually. And one truth about veteran friendships is that a loss suffered by one is felt by all.

Clinically speaking, grief is a natural response to loss. It's the emotional suffering we feel when something or someone we love is taken away.

Often, the pain of loss can feel overwhelming. We may experience a variety of difficult and even unexpected emotions, from shock or anger to disbelief, guilt, and profound sadness. The pain of grief can affect our physical health, making it difficult to sleep, eat, carry out daily activities and think straight. These are normal reactions to loss, and the more significant the loss, the more intense the grief.

"Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted" Matthew 5:4

Grief is the way God intended for us to deal with loss. It is nature's way of healing a broken heart. There is no timetable for dealing with grief. We all must be allowed to grieve at our own pace. Some may move through a loss rather quickly, but that does not mean they are stronger, and neither are they necessarily less caring. Some take more time, but that does not mean they are weak, and neither are they necessarily more caring. It is just a reflection of the fact that we are each different.

We may take two steps forward and three back. Our grief will rise up within us at the most unexpected and inopportune times and places. Grieving tends to be a cyclical rather than a linear process. We sometimes reach a point where we're feeling better only to feel bad again. It is not a sign that we have relapsed or getting worse; rather, it is how grief works, and it is actually a sign of moving forward. There are times we can be in the middle of an ordinary task and all of a sudden we start to cry. Grief is a series of loops where we circle back to where we were earlier in the process.

"The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit." Psalm 34:18

This verse reminds us that God is not only present with us, but near. Near to the pain we feel. Near to the loss we can't fill. Not only is He near, but He stays with us and will help us through our pain. When we are brokenhearted, God gives us the strength and courage we need to breathe again.

When we feel like our physical and emotional tanks are empty, we need to remember that we are not alone. God is near and so are our family and friends. We need other people. Very few, if any of us, can navigate the grieving process alone. We benefit when we let others in on our grief and we need to be able to tell others what we need, and in most cases it may not be advice; rather a compassionate ear and practical support.

Prayer: O Lord, we call upon You in our time of sorrow. You give us the strength and will to bear our heavy burdens. I know You are here with me in my grief. Lord, take this pain and help me bear it. I know You are mending the brokenness in ways I can't always see. Amen


