#### **CHAPLAIN'S CORNER**

#### What Are We Doing Under The Circumstances?

On Thanksgiving Day this year, as in the past, many of us will pray with family and friends, because the holidays are a time when we take time to outwardly express our gratitude for our blessings. In Psalms, God says that giving thanks is a "sacrifice that truly honors me." Why is it a sacrifice to give thanks when it's an easy thing to do? It is a sacrifice because it requires more than words ... it requires action. We are called to live each day giving thanks because thanksgiving is simply too big for one day.

When I was a young man, I remember my pastor would ask someone how they were doing. Many times, they would reply "I'm okay, under the circumstances." He would respond, "What are you doing under the circumstances?" Later in life, I began to understand that I should give thanks for God's unfailing love; and, I am never under the circumstances because God is always present, lifting me above my challenges and adversity.

This is the key to rising above the circumstances: Focus on what we have, not on what we don't have. When we focus on what we lack, we tend to look out for ourselves. Conversely, when we focus on our blessings, we tend to find ourselves looking out for others as well as ourselves. I believe the greatest witnesses for God are those who have experienced the worst of life and yet have the best of attitudes, continuing to praise God no matter what the circumstances.

On many occasions in the Psalms, David lamented about his circumstances (Psalms 42; 57; 62). However, more often than not, about midway through David's laments, he begins praising God for who He is and thanking God for what He's done. And you know what happened? David started to feel better. Life wasn't so bad after all. His problems grew smaller as his perspective of God grew larger, and he began to see God's glory shining through the situation. Why is that? Because David shifted from depression to rejoicing. David didn't wait until God changed his situation, solved his problem, or made him feel better before he began thanking Him.

And in this same way, we too can change our perspective. We will begin seeing moments of sudden glory through the lens of praise and thanksgiving – moments of glory that were there all along, but hidden from us because we allowed ourselves to be under our circumstances. Gratitude is simply an attitude. The one thing we can always choose each day, in any situation, is our attitude. Therefore, we always have the ability to choose an attitude of gratitude.

**Prayer:** Heavenly Father, Almighty God, on this day of Thanksgiving, I will remember that you called me to give thanks in all circumstances. Father, Thank You for the countless blessings You have bestowed upon me, both in times of joy and in times of challenge. Help me to always maintain a heart filled with gratitude, not just on this special day but every day of my life. May I give thanks in all things. Amen

## **MILITARY ORDER PURPLE HEART**

Whether you were stationed overseas or never left the US during your tour of duty. Combat veteran or stood ready during the Cold War just in case. Volunteer or draftee. This month I want to recognize all our veterans for the sacrifices made every day in the service to our great country and say thank you for your service.



The US Marine Corps celebrates its birthday on 10 November so congratulations to all our Marines out there, Semper Fi!

11 November is not just Veterans Day but is also the day the Armistice was signed in 1918 to end the Great War or what was then called the war to end all wars. The US had 4.7 million that served during the war, 320,000 were sick or wounded, and 116,616 were killed during the war. My great-grandfather served as an NCO with the First Infantry Division during the war. A bullet grazed his head and he was gassed twice by the Germans. He woke up in a hospital on November 11th and complained to the nurse that he had a pounding headache. She told him it may be just from all the church bells ringing because the war was over. He continued to have breathing issues long after the war due to the damage to his lungs caused by the mustard gas. I never got to meet him, he passed away at the age of 57, but I was able to hear stories of his time in the war from my great-grandmother when she showed me some of the pictures he took after the war while waiting to return home.

I mention my great-grandfather because not all wounds are visible to the naked eye. His death was directly attributed to the mustard gas that severely damaged his lungs, but you wouldn't know he had any health issues unless you tried to talk to him. My great-grandmother outlived him by 30 years. The injuries and wounds we received during our time in service may shorten our life expectancy just like what happened to my great-grandfather. The VA gives you money for your disability rating as compensation for not being able to live a normal life due to the injuries you are now living with.

Loneliness, depression, or TBI you cannot see them, but they can contribute to the early death of a veteran. The veteran community has a 57% higher suicide rate than the non-veteran population in our country. According to the VA, 6,146 veterans committed suicide in 2020, that equals almost 17 a day! Please check on your battle buddies and pay close attention to not just what they say but how they look when they talk to you. You never know, by taking the time just to check in on them, you may have just convinced them not to take their life.
