## **MILITARY ORDER PURPLE HEART**

On 15 September our Nation will celebrate POW/MIA Recognition Day. This is when we pause and remember all our service members that were prisoners of war or those who are still listed as missing in action. Modern science has helped immensely in our Nation's quest to return all our fallen home and provide a sense of closure to the families that have waited to be able to finally know for sure their loved one is accounted for and finally resting in a marked grave.



The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency has a tough but important mission. They have been successful in linking unidentified remains to artifacts that were later discovered in the vicinity of where the remains were originally found and with DNA analysis.

While this is good news, there is still a long way to go. There are still 72,187 service members missing from World War II, 7,492 missing from the Korean War, and 1,578 missing from the Vietnam War. Please keep them and their families in your thoughts and prayers. Each of these Purple Heart recipients deserves our gratitude for services rendered to our country. Let's keep them in our prayers until the day there are no longer any missing and unknowns.

#### Youth Scholarships and Teacher of the Year Awards Nominations

Voice of Democracy and Patriot's Pen submissions as well as Teacher of the Year nominations are being solicited through 31 October 2023.

#### Voice of Democracy (High School):

Established in 1947, the Voice of Democracy audio-essay program provides high school students with the unique opportunity to express themselves in regards to a democratic and patriotic-themed recorded essay. Each year, nearly 25,000 ninth through 12th grade students from across the country enter to win their share of more than \$1.3 million in educational scholarships and incentives awarded through the program.

This year's theme is: "What Are the Greatest Attributes of Our Democracy?"

Prizes are awarded at the Post, State and National levels. The Post awards \$100-\$1,000 for winners and increases to \$35,000 for the winner at National level.

#### Patriot's Pen (Grades 6-8):

Each year, nearly 68,800 students in sixth through eighth grades enter the VFW's Patriot's Pen youth essay contest for a chance to win their share of more than \$1.4 million in state and national awards.

This year's theme is: "How Are You Inspired by America?"

Prizes are awarded at the Post, State and National levels. The Post awards \$50-\$500 for winners and increases to \$5,000 for the winner at National level.

#### Teacher of the Year (Elementary, Middle and High School):

Without our nation's veterans, America wouldn't be the great nation it is today. Our youth deserve to learn about our rich history, traditions and the role of our veterans in creating and shaping America.

Each year, the Veterans of Foreign Wars selects elementary, middle, and high school teachers to participate in the Smart/Maher VFW National Citizenship Education Teacher program.

The Post awards \$300 to each awardee and increase through the National level.
