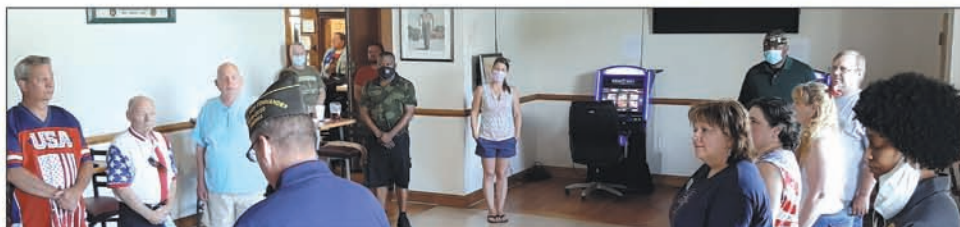

deceased spouse, parent, child, sibling, grandparent or grandchild.

Step- and adopted parents, children, siblings (and half-siblings), grandparents and grandchildren are considered the same as biological parents, children, siblings, grandparents and grandchildren and may join the VFW Auxiliary under their VFW-eligible veteran.

Why aren't in-laws, cousins, uncles/aunts, nephews/nieces, great grandparents/great-grandchildren of veterans eligible? The IRS determines the degrees of separation from the veteran that qualify for membership in a veterans' service organization auxiliary. The relationship must be within two degrees of "consanguinity" to be eligible. That means two generations back (i.e. parents or grandparents) or forward (i.e. children or grandchildren).

MILITARY ORDER OF THE PURPLE HEART

Patriots:

We had a short but good meeting at the Post pavilion on the 18th. We decided with approval from Post Commander to conduct a **Viola Drive** at the Post on National Purple Heart Day! We also discussed our participation at the National Purple Heart Day ceremony at Mount Vernon on the actual Purple Heart Day of Friday, August 7th. Some facts about the Purple Heart:

The Purple Heart's first predecessor, the Fidelity Medallion, was created in 1780 by the Continental Congress, but was only awarded to three soldiers that year. Two years later, in 1782, President George Washington created the Badge of Military Merit. Because the Fidelity Medallion was never again bestowed, it is generally thought of as commemorative, and the Badge of Military Merit is instead considered to be the first U.S. military decoration and the Purple Heart's predecessor. According to Washington, who designed the badge in the form of a cloth purple heart, the medal would be given to soldiers who displayed "not only instances of unusual gallantry in battle, but also extraordinary fidelity and essential service in any way." The Badge of Military Merit later became known as the Purple Heart, which is still presented to U.S. service members today.

Thanks to Army Gen. Douglas MacArthur, the Purple Heart officially received its modern-day look and name in 1932. The revived medal was designated primarily as a combat decoration, recognizing commendable action as well as those wounded or killed in combat. A few years later in 1944, the qualifications for receiving a Purple Heart changed to what we know today: an award given only to those wounded or killed in enemy action.

On George Washington's 200th birthday, February 22, 1932, the Purple Heart Medal was reinstated by a Congressional Act. It was redesigned by Elizabeth Will with the likeness of George Washington and the original Badge of Military Merit and that design is the Purple Heart Medal as we know it today. Purple Heart Day is observed August 7th of each year. This tradition started in 2014 and is not a national holiday, but a day for us to pause and remember those who have sacrificed their lives for our country.

The next **Chapter Meeting** is on **Saturday, August 15th**. We need to continue to be proactive in helping our wounded Veterans and their families!! Our Chapter's mission is to serve our combat wounded veterans and their families. Call me at **703-244-5428**
