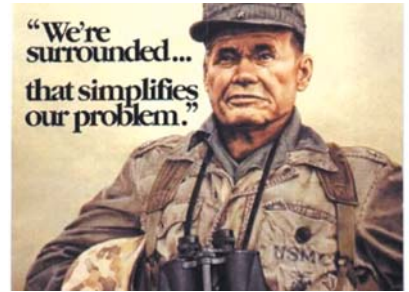

MILITARY ORDER PURPLE HEART

The Battle for Okinawa

Okinawa is the largest of the Ryukyu Islands, located only 340 miles from Japan. Capturing these islands would allow the US military to base ships and aircraft in the area that could threaten key shipping routes to bring critical resources to Japan to fuel its war industries and allow US bombers to base even closer to the Japanese islands.

The 10th US Army, consisted of the 3rd Amphibious Corps of the US Marine Corps that was made up of the 1st, 2nd and 6th Marine Divisions and XXIV Corps of the US Army made up of the 7th, 27th, 77th, and 96th Infantry Divisions. The Army totaled 250,000 combat troops and was supported by the US Navy's 5th Fleet. The Japanese 32nd Army was made up of the 24th, 28th, and 62nd Infantry Divisions, 45th, 59th, and 60th Mixed Brigades and the 27th Tank Regiment, totaled 76,000 soldiers and approximately 40,000 Okinawan conscripts, they were supported by the 2nd Japanese Fleet.

The Japanese built successive belts of well-prepared defensive positions and obstacles as they prepared for possible attack; they took advantage of the terrain and denied all potential flanking routes to the attacking forces. Despite a bombing campaign and pre-invasion naval gunfire the vast majority of the Japanese defenses remain intact since they were away from the beaches targeted for the landings. On 1 April 1945, the battle started with the largest amphibious assault of the Pacific Theater. The beach landings were mostly unopposed and units quickly achieved their initial objectives and cut the island in two. The weather for most of May was hot with unceasing torrential rain, which further benefitted the defenders. The fighting was usually at close-quarters and extremely violent. They faced off in trenches, pillboxes, bunkers and caves. The 10th Army was only able to advance 4 miles in the first 7 weeks of the battle. Once the rains eased up, the 10th Army was able to advance the final 10 miles of the island in 4 weeks against a weakened enemy. Prior to the invasion, the Japanese told everyone on the island that the Americans would kill everyone, even the women and children. This made the defenders furiously fight as they were gradually pushed out of their defensive positions and hiding places. When trapped and out of ammunition some of the defenders and civilians refused to surrender and committed suicide rather than surrender to the Americans.

110,000 of the Japanese defenders were killed in action or died and only 7,400 were captured. The American casualties were 12,520 killed or missing in action and 36,631 wounded in action. Not only was the fighting fierce in the ground, but the Japanese unleashed ferocious kamikaze attacks on the US fleet that resulted in sinking 36 ships and damaging 386 ships. The US lost a total of 763 aircraft during the battle. The Japanese lost 16 warships and over 7,800 aircraft. The battle lasted for 82 days.

This would turn out to be the last battle of World War II. Allied leaders were afraid of the losses that would be inflicted if they invaded the Japanese main islands. The savage nature and scale of battle for Okinawa led to the decision to drop atomic bombs on Hiroshima on 6 August and Nagasaki on 9 August 1945, causing Japan to surrender on 15 August, ending World War II.

24 Medals of Honor were awarded for actions during the battle and over 49,000 Purple Hearts were awarded.
