



MILITARY ORDER PURPLE HEART

The US Invasion of Panama OPERATION JUST CAUSE

In the late 1980s, relations between the United States and General Manuel Noriega, Panama's de facto military dictator and a former CIA asset, deteriorated significantly due to his involvement in drug trafficking, racketeering, and the suppression of democracy. Noriega had annulled the results of the May 1989 general election, which was widely believed to have been won by opposition candidate Guillermo Endara. President Bush called on Noriega to honor the will of the Panamanian people, started reinforcing the US bases in the Canal Zone, and increased training and other activities to apply pressure on Noriega.



On December 15th, the Panamanian general assembly passed a resolution declaring that a state of war existed between Panama and the US. This led to escalating clashes with US forces in the region, including the killing of an off-duty US Marine officer, that brought tensions to a head.

The operation began in the early hours of December 20, 1989, involving a force of more than 27,000 personnel from the US Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force and Coast Guard participated. US Army Rangers, Navy SEALs, and the 82nd Airborne Division led the assault on key targets and military installations throughout Panama City and its surroundings and met scattered resistance from the Panamanian Defense Forces (PDF). The invasion was swift and the PDF was quickly overwhelmed, with major organized resistance effectively crushed by Christmas Eve. Guillermo Endara was sworn in as the new president of Panama on a U.S. military base shortly after the invasion began.

Noriega eluded immediate capture and sought refuge in the Vatican's diplomatic mission in Panama City. On January 3, 1990, Noriega surrendered to US authorities and was flown to the United States to face trial. In 1992, he was convicted in a U.S. federal court on eight counts of drug trafficking, racketeering, and money laundering, marking the first time a U.S. jury had convicted a foreign leader of such charges. He was sentenced to a lengthy prison term, and after serving time in the U.S. and later being extradited to France and then Panama, he died in 2017.

23 US service members, three US civilians were killed, and 325 US service members were wounded. Estimates for Panamanian casualties ranged from 516 (314 soldiers, 202 civilians) to several thousand, according to some human rights groups. 2 Navy Crosses, 13 Silver Stars, 130 Bronze Stars, and 248 Purple Hearts were awarded after Operation Just Cause.

POST HISTORIAN'S ARCHIVE

Fellow veterans and history enthusiasts of VFW Post 1503, as we approach the holiday season, December offers a poignant opportunity to reflect on our nation's past amid the winter chill. From Revolutionary War triumphs to solemn remembrances, the Virginia, Maryland, and D.C. region brims with events that honor the sacrifices of those who came before us. As your post historian, I've curated a concise list of accessible, veteran-friendly outings – many free or low-cost – for the month ahead. Bundle up, gather your comrades, and step into living history. These experiences not only educate but also strengthen the bonds of service we all share.



December 6-7: Battle of Great Bridge Reenactment *Location: Great Bridge Battlefield & Waterways History Park, Chesapeake, VA (1.5-hour drive from Alexandria).* Commemorate the 250th anniversary of this pivotal 1775 Revolutionary War clash – often called “Virginia’s Bunker Hill” – with narrated reenactments, encampments, artisan demos, and kids’ activities. Witness Patriot forces repel the British in a short but fierce battle that secured Virginia’s independence. Free admission; food trucks on-site. A stirring reminder of early American resolve.

December 6: Annapolis Historic Day Trip *Location: Annapolis, MD (45-minute drive from D.C.).* Join a guided exploration of Maryland’s colonial capital, site of the Confederation Congress and temporary U.S. capital in 1783-84. Tour the State House where George Washington resigned his commission on December 23, 1783, and the Treaty of Paris was ratified, ending the Revolution. Includes museum visits and lunch in a historic tavern. Private tours ~\$150/person; book via Hipstoric DC. Ideal for pondering leadership in victory.

December 12-13, 19, 22-23: Mount Vernon by Candlelight *Location: George Washington’s Mount Vernon, Alexandria, VA (20-minute drive).* Stroll the estate aglow with 18th-century lanterns, enjoying holiday music, sweet treats, and tales of Washington’s Yuletide traditions. Tours highlight his role as a unifying figure post-Revolution. Tickets \$33-\$41 (members discounted); evenings 5:30-8:30 p.m. A serene nod to the Father of Our Country, perfect for quiet reflection.

December 13: Wreaths Across America at Arlington National Cemetery *Location: Arlington National Cemetery, Arlington, VA (10-minute drive).* Honor fallen heroes by placing wreaths on over 400,000 graves during this annual rite, starting at 8 a.m. with a noon ceremony. Sponsored by volunteers nationwide, it embodies “Remember, Honor, Teach.” Free to participate (register online for updates); expect crowds – arrive early. As veterans, this is our sacred duty, echoing Pearl Harbor’s legacy just days later on the 7th (self-guided visits encouraged).

December 20-21: Christmas Illuminations at Mount Vernon *Location: George Washington’s Mount Vernon, Alexandria, VA.* The estate sparkles with lights, lantern paths, and Potomac views, featuring historical reenactments and a visit from a four-legged “Mount Vernon resident” (think Washington’s hounds). Blends 18th-century festivity with modern wonder. Tickets \$41/adult; 5:30-8:30 p.m. End the month with Washington’s vision of peace after war.

These outings align with America’s 250th birthday celebrations, emphasizing themes of liberty and service dear to us at Post 1503. Many sites offer veteran discounts – mention your status. For carpooling or group rates, contact me at vandergriffdonald@usa.net. Let’s turn history’s pages together, ensuring the stories of valor endure. Semper Fi, Hooah, and seasons’ greetings.

They pretend to be official VA representatives and use official communication channels to demand repayment for alleged benefits overpayments. Fraudulent letters, emails and texts often include fake VA letterheads and logos, making it difficult to distinguish genuine VA communications from scams.




