



CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Resolution or Wish?

New Year's is a day commonly known for making resolutions. It is a time to reflect on where our life has been, where it is, and where we want it to be. Which begs a fundamental question, what is a resolution?

The dictionary tells us a resolution means to make a solid decision to do something, or to not do something. When we think of New Year's resolutions, we think of those things in our lives that we want to improve, as well as those things we want to stop doing. Let's compare the definition of a resolution to that of a wish. The dictionary states a wish means to "express a strong desire or hope for something that is not easily attainable; to want something that cannot or probably will not happen."

There is absolutely nothing wrong with making a list of resolutions at the start of a new year. We need to remember, though, to commit ourselves to those items on our list, to really work toward them instead of just writing something down as a wish. Here's how it works:

"The heart of a person plans his way, but the Lord establishes his steps."

Proverbs 16:9

This verse reveals how we can actively partner with God to achieve our resolutions rather than passively wishing for a desired outcome. A resolution is a promise we make to ourselves, with God as our accountability partner, to actively change or improve something in our lives. Conversely, a wish is a passive hope or desire for something without committing to a tangible plan to make it happen.

A resolution is a concrete, actionable version of a wish, based on a firm commitment to work toward a goal with God's help and guidance. When making resolutions, God will help us establish our steps or plan of action to achieve our goals.

"Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and he will establish your plans."

Proverbs 16:3
