MILITARY ORDER PURPLE HEART

Fellow Veterans,

Fittingly, the month of May is National Military Appreciation Month in the United States of America:

We celebrate Silver Star Service Banner Day on 1 May in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, several territories and the Chickasaw Nation. State and local governments issue proclamations and people are asked to fly a Silver Star Banner to honor our wounded, ill military personnel.

10 May is Military Spouse Appreciation Day where we recognize all the sacrifices made by the spouses of our service members. The long training days, field training exercises, pre-deployment certifications, temporary duty assignments, deployments, unaccompanied tours, and combat deployments all leave the spouse as the sole parent to raise the children and manage the household while their loved one is doing our Nation's bidding.

Children of the Fallen Patriots Day is celebrated on 13 May. This day was created to bring attention to the young family members that are often overlooked when the parent that is serving in our military is lost in the line of duty.

19 May is Armed Forces Day. This day was set aside to honor the men and women that serve in our Armed Forces and the Coast Guard.

The most recognized is Memorial Day on 27 May. This National Holiday was set aside to commemorate the sacrifices of our military service members. Americans are asked to reflect and honor those who lost their lives while fighting our Nations wars.

Locally, On 5 May 2025, Chapter 1775 of the Military Order of the Purple Heart will celebrate our 35th Anniversary! Stop by and say hi if you see us in the VFW, we normally hold our meetings on the 3rd Saturday of the month in the canteen.

Listen up Cooties and MOCA!

Did you know that some Comrades are hesitant to become a part of the Military Order of the Cootie because they don't want to be subjected to the initiations – in fact the initiation and degree work are optional, and the only requirements are the obligations, signs and passwords of the Ritual. No portion of any Ritual, including initiation or degree work, is conducted in a public setting. Cooties operate a little differently than our parent organization the VFW. We do a lot of things backwards. For instance, when something is good, we say the opposite that it is 'lousy'. Our Officers are called shavetails and our organization at the post level is called a pup tent.

Cooties are the 'honor' degree of the VFW and being one requires you commit to serving veterans with a focus on the hospitalized or ill veterans as well as surviving spouses and children of veterans. In fact, the Military Order of the Cooties and our Auxiliary started the VFW National Home in Eaton Rapids, Michigan 100 years ago to support Military Families, Surviving Spouses and their Children! POST HISTORIAN'S ARCHIVE

“Those who don’t know history are destined to repeat it.” *Edmund Burke*

In my last article, we put out some of our ideas for people to look at. I received an impressive amount of feedback via both email and personal conversations. Among the responses, we had some excellent suggestions about what people would like to see the Post do and what they would like to take part in.

The largest percentage of responses were from people that would like to go on historic tours. From conversation I have had with people around the Post, it sounds like 2 tours a year was the most popular frequency for the events. For the most part, responses have indicated that local military history was the popular topic for these tours. Other responses centered around starting up a reading club once we get the Post library set up; speakers being invited in to add historical content to our Post observance date events; and producing some profiles from a military history perspective history on Post personnel.

I will be working with Kelly Behm, Post Entertainment Chair, to come up with plans for upcoming tour opportunities to propose to our Post Commander for consideration. More details to follow.

Last month I posted a list of several historical events in April. They were limited to largely American Civil War events. A couple of members I spoke to recommended that I expand the range to include more historical eras. I will continue to research the best sources of military historical information I can provide for members. CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

What, Me Worry?

Many of us who grew up in the 1950's through the 1970's recognizes this statement as the motto of Alfred E. Neuman, the fictitious mascot of Mad Magazine. In the Bible we are told several times, "Do not worry" or "Do not be anxious." However, simply telling an anxious person to stop being anxious rarely helps.

"Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God."

Philippians 4:6

This instruction to "not be anxious" is saying much more than "don't worry" or don't sweat it." Rather, it is reminding us that there are things beyond our control that require us to trust in God's care and provision. This is a lesson I've had to learn repeatedly in life — I've never been in charge when facing adversity or one of life's many struggles.

Yet, it is human nature to need to be in control when being confronted with adversity. This promotes a vicious circle or cycle: First, we want to be in control. Second, we don't like being dependent on others. Third, we claim our dependence on God; but insecurity further drives our desire for control, and realizing that we're not in control, intensifies our insecurity — and the result is increased anxiety... and the cycle continues.

The cycle continues until we acknowledge that God cares deeply for all of us and that God will certainly provide for us. Believing in God's grace and divine provision provides the power we need to reset our focus in life and break the vicious cycle of worry. We cannot get past our anxiety without believing that God is in control, that He loves us, and knows what is best for us... always.

PRAYER: Heavenly Father, Almighty God, in the midst of life's uncertainties and anxieties, help me to realize that I am not in control. I surrender all my worry, fears, doubts, and concerns to your loving care. Help me release the grip of anxiety that holds me captive, knowing that you are in control of all things. *Amen*

FOCUS FOR THIS MONTH:

VFW Virginia VSO Program to Close

While this isn't the best news for the Department of Virginia, it is a necessary change given the financial realities of today. The letter from VFW State Commander Mitch Rubenstein, printed in the April Department General Orders, explains the reasoning for this decision follows:

Comrades:

On March 18th your Council of Administration held a Special meeting to discuss vital business of the Department. As part of that meeting a discussion was held concerning the Service Officer Program.

The Service officer program for the Department of Virginia has taken a hit over the last few years. Having two Department Officers covering the entire state is not giving our veterans and their families the attention that they deserve to fully complete their claims. Therefore, the Council felt a need for a change. As of 1 April, our staff have been instructed not to take on any new clients or power of attorney's and begin the process of deferring all new claims to the Virginia Department of Veteran Services.

We have established a strong network and working relationship with DVS, which will give our members a larger pool to assist the veterans in every district. Our tax dollars are now funding 78 fully accredited full-time service officers and 21 administrative positions across the commonwealth now devoted to serving our veteran community. In addition, DVS also has a fully funded and staffed appeals team to represent Virginia veterans before the Board of Veterans Appeals and the U.S. Court of Appeals for Veterans Claims.

Due to fiscal realities the Council felt this was in the best interest of our veteran community. There is going to be a period of transition over the next few months, and we urge our members to be patient during this time. Our program will officially end on September 1, 2025, but the DVS will be there for our members starting April 1st, 2025.

This was a very difficult decision to make but one your Council felt was in the best interest of Virginia's veterans and their families.

My personal thanks go out to our dedicated VFW VSOs, Laurie Clay and Raymond Bailey, for their hard work over their time with the VFW. We look forward to their continued pursuits in serving our veterans.

There will be a resource page centered on agencies and avenues to pursue claims filing and services created on the Department website soon. In the meantime, here is a link to a VA website that can help you find an accredited service representative:

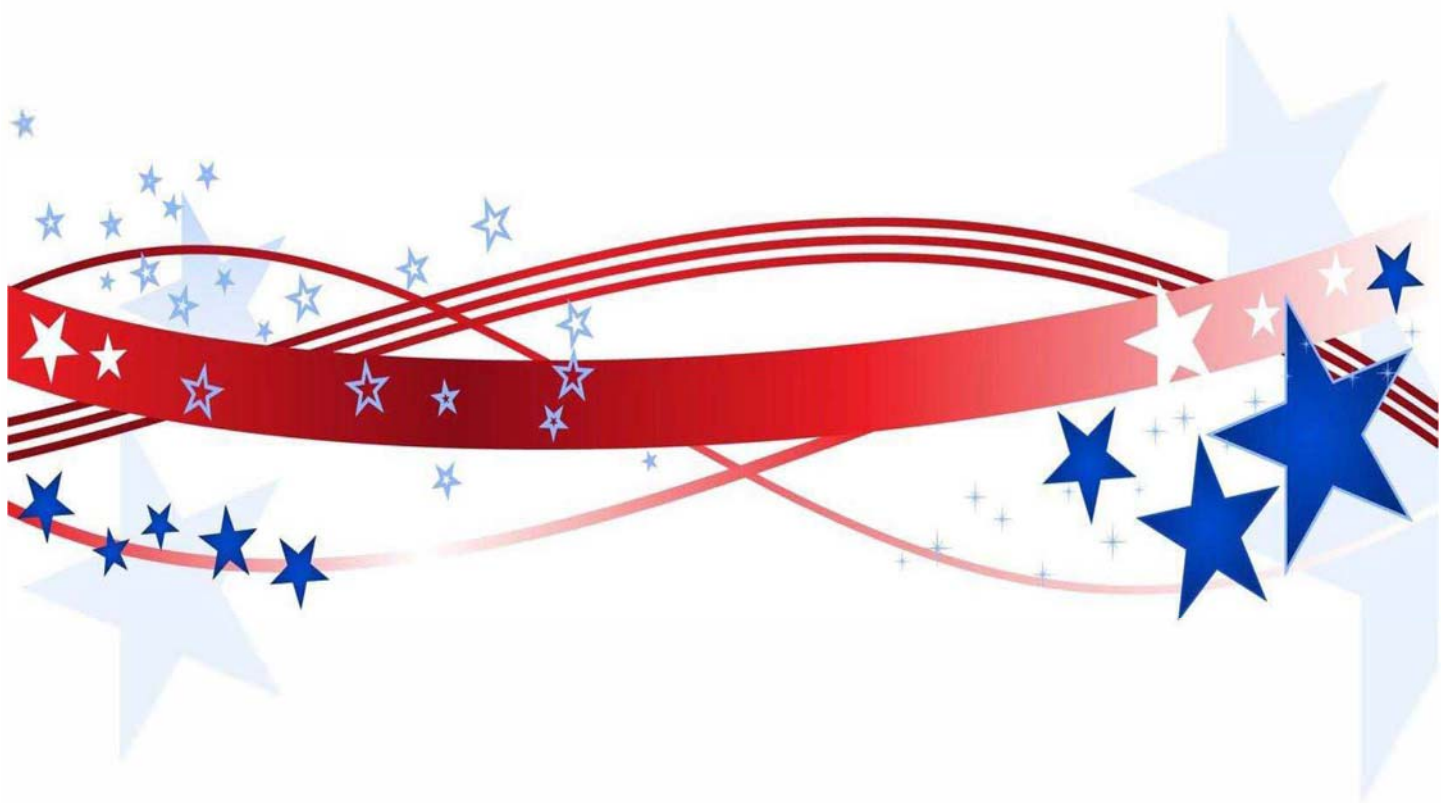

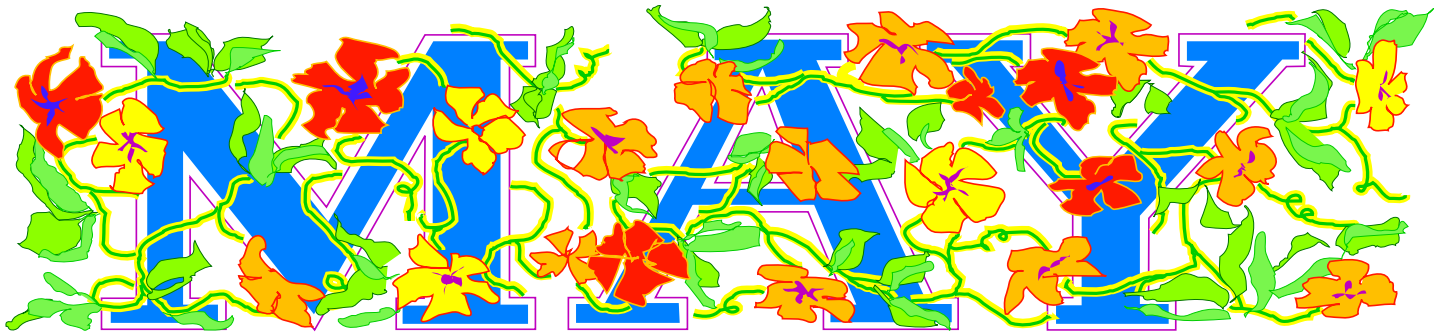
