CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Developing a Spirit of Patience

On any given day, we may encounter frustrating people and situations, such as an uncooperative coworker, a slow commute, inconsiderate persons, to name a VERY few. We even experience frustrations with friends and family. We might feel like lashing out, but God wants us to stay calm and be patient with everyone.

Ephesians 4:2-3

"Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace."

This passage says a number of things about developing a spirit of patience: First, God urges us to be tolerant, kind, and bear each other's burdens. Second, we should recognize the adverse effect of impatience. It can close-off communication and lead to conflict. When we employ the words that rise naturally to our lips, we run the risk of giving the greatest speech we'll ever live to regret. We wind up saying things we can never take back. What we do without thinking on the spur of the moment is seldom right.

Responding calmly gives people room to be wrong and a chance to make a change in their behavior. And consider we sometimes jump to conclusions in certain situations, especially when emotions are high. Therefore, responding calmly, rather than reacting negatively, also gives us room to be wrong as well.

Patience empowers us to navigate through difficult moments without becoming agitated. When we find ourselves losing patience, we should take a deep breath and ask ourselves: Will this matter tomorrow? Will this matter a week or even a month from now? If we answer "no" to each of these questions, then it's time to be calm, and practice patience and tolerance.

Patience is also about getting through "times of waiting." We may have to deal with anxiety brought on by health issues or countless other challenges. Maybe we are waiting on a diagnosis for a difficult health condition; or, maybe we have to wait to see if a health treatment will result in healing and relief. It could be waiting on a needed job, promotion or raise we are earnestly seeking.

The longer something takes to come about, the more we think we need to help it along. There's a line from an old song that says, "The waiting is the hardest part." For a moment we need to mentally step back and try to look at the problem objectively; then, we need to hold steady for a period of time. Finally, we need take those actions within our control and turn the rest over to God and his timing.

The word patience translates into long-suffering or steadfastness. The concept of patience is holding steady in the face of opposition or challenge. It is a powerful word denoting self-control in difficult times. The Bible uses the term to describe a soldier who was holding an outpost, and when he was under attack, he stood his ground. A final thought: Patience doesn't mean we have to like the circumstances; rather, it means finding the ability to "relax and let God."

Prayer: Heavenly Father, I confess that I often grow impatient when things don't go according to my plan, or when people don't behave the way I think they should. Please forgive me, and help me to be patient with others, as You have been patient with me. Help me to rely upon Your grace and enable me to remain calm and steadfast in challenging moments.

MILITARY ORDER OF THE PURPLE HEART

The Purple Heart Trail

The original idea for the Purple Heart Trail came from Patriot Frank J. Kuhn, Jr., a member of Chapter 1732 in Virginia. His idea was approved at the 1992 MOPH National Convention and the MOPH National Purple Heart Trail began. The Purple Heart Trail originates at a monument in Mt Vernon, Virginia. Mt Vernon is the



burial location of George Washington, who is recognized as the creator of the "Badge of Merit" which evolved to become the Purple Heart Medal we know today. This monument marks the origin of the Purple Heart Trail.

The Purple Heart Trail was created to be a symbolic and honorary system of roads, highways, bridges, and other monuments that give tribute to the men and women who have been awarded the Purple Heart medal. The Purple Heart Trail accomplishes this honorary goal by posting signs as visual reminders to those who use the road system that others have paid a high price for their freedom to travel and live in a free society. Signs placed at various locations annotate those states, counties, cities, towns, roads, highways, rivers, bridges, and buildings where legislation has been passed to designate them parts of The Purple Heart Trail. There are even Indian Reservations, NHL teams, NBA Teams, and NFL Teams, and businesses that have become part of the Purple Heart Trail.

There are currently Purple Heart Trail locations designated in 49 states as well as Guam and Puerto Rico. The actual format and design of the signs vary from state to state.
